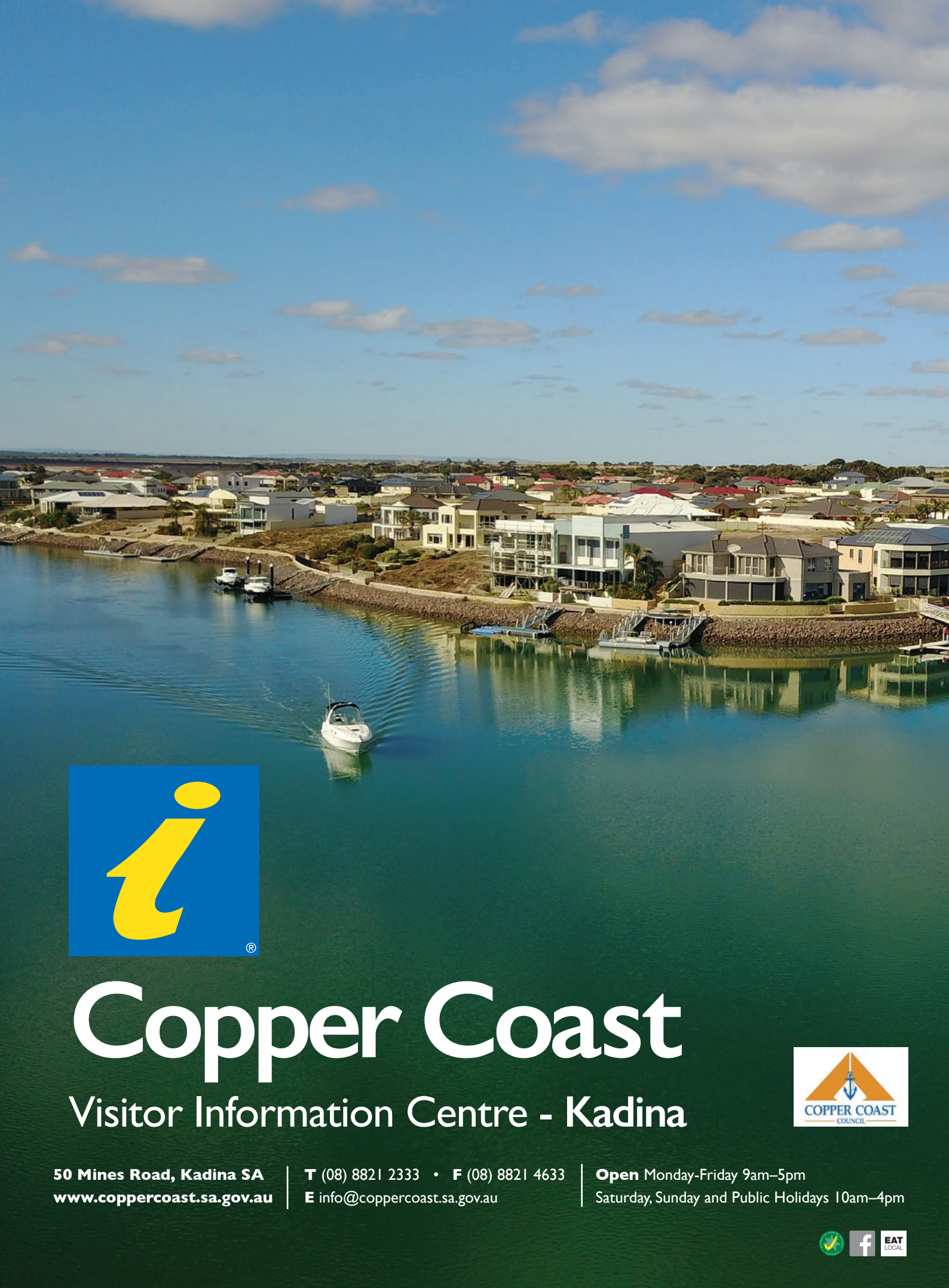

## Getting to Yorke Peninsula

### By road

Whether you are bringing your own vehicle or hiring one, driving through Yorke Peninsula is a wonderful experience. Follow National Highway One from Adelaide – your journey along the peninsula begins north of Port Wakefield. Towns and attractions are close to one another, so travel at your own pace and stop to take in the sights! Petrol stations are present in most towns. Just remember most close around 5pm or 6pm.

### By coach

Yorke Peninsula Coaches operate regular services from Adelaide Central Bus Station on Franklin Street to various towns throughout Yorke Peninsula. There is a separate inter-town bus route connecting towns in the southern part of the region, but in general there are limited bus services between major towns on the peninsula.

### Cycling

There is no better way to enjoy Yorke Peninsula's diverse landscapes than by bike. The Walk the Yorke leisure trail offers shared cycling/walking trails around the coastline, and the new sealed Rail Trail connects the towns of Kadina and Wallaroo following the old railway line. There are shelters and interpretive signs along both the Walk the Yorke and Rail Trails. The Copper Coast Visitor Information Centre offers free bike hire to visitors and many caravan parks offer bike hire to their patrons.

## Getting around Yorke Peninsula



Yorke Peninsula has a spectacular and interesting history waiting to be explored. Download or pick up a Coastal Way map from [www.yorkepeninsula.com.au](http://www.yorkepeninsula.com.au) or visitor information centres around South Australia and follow the Coastal Way road trip signs to discover Yorke Peninsula's key experiences.

The road trip starts from Port Wakefield down to Ardrossan through Stansbury to Innes National Park, up to Moonta, Kadina and

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# Coastal Way



## 1 Port Wakefield

Break up the drive with a stop at a bakery, café or pub. Take a stroll along the wharf area. Walk along boardwalks through mangrove forests and view the abundant birdlife or take a dip in the local swimming area.

## 2 Ardrossan

Home of the Blue Swimmer crab, Ardrossan is known for its jetty fishing and imposing red cliffs. Ardrossan is also home to the Stump Jump Plough, the museum pays tribute to this ingenious implement and is housed in the original plough factory.

## 3 Port Vincent

The attractive and peaceful bay with a marina at the northern end provides a safe harbour for yachties and boatsies. Kids of all ages love playing in the crystal clear waters and swimming out to the pontoon followed by a treat of icecream and hot donuts or fish and chips on the beach.

# Home Grown Trail



## 1 Oysters, Stansbury

Try your hand at 'Deckie for a Day' with Pacific Estate Oysters where you can shuck and chow down on fresh oysters. Tours by appointment only, phone 0467 485 291. Drop into Southern Yorke Oysters to grab yourself some locally grown oysters and view oyster grading. For trading hours, call Paul on 0407 189 121.

## 2 Barachel Alpacas, Wool Bay

Alpacas are adored for their softness and friendliness. Baby alpacas are onsite most of the year and visitors can feed them. Visit the farm shop to purchase quality alpaca products. Visitors are welcome Monday to Saturday, phone 0438 528 029 or 0400 017 120.

## 3 Baker Bros. Gallery at the Top Shop, Warooka

This historic shop sells local artisan food and handcrafted art. It's a great place to stock-up on local produce and quality artworks. Phone Steph on 0408 545 003.

# The Inland Drive



## 1 Lake Bumbunga

A popular photo spot along Highway One, Lake Bumbunga is on the northern edge of the region. A vibrant pink colour from high salinity levels, it can change from white to pink to blue depending on the salt content and season.

## 2 Bute

If you love colourful bromeliads, head to Bute where the local nursery (the only one of its kind in the state) has 1400 varieties. The Railway Reserve and neighbouring Fauna Park is a great picnic spot.

## 3 Kadina

The largest town on Yorke Peninsula - stop off at the indoor play centre or Victoria Square playground, or visit the Farm Shed Museum on the southern side of town. There are also plenty of cafés or shops to explore.

# History, Art & Culture



## 1 Wallaroo

Explore the Wallaroo Town Walking Trail to learn about the area. Visit the Wallaroo Heritage Museum to see 'George The Giant Squid', measuring an impressive 1.5m x 8.5m. The former Tipara Lighthouse, once located off Moonta Bay, can be seen just outside the museum.

## 2 Moonta Mines

A wealth of history, Moonta Mines is a National Heritage site offering a number of exciting experiences. Be sure to visit the sweets shop and museum or ride the tourist railway on a 50-minute guided tour.

## 3 Stansbury

Explore the local museum which delves into the pastoral and maritime history of the town, including its beginnings as Oyster Bay where locals harvested wild and Angasi oysters. Discover the many murals scattered around town created by talented artists, along the main street and by the playground.

# Self-drive itineraries

## 4 Marion Bay / Innes National Park

Situated on the 'foot', Marion Bay is the gateway to Innes National Park. With surf, swimming beaches, secluded rock pools, an abundance of wildlife and a variety of fishing this is a paradise worth exploring.

## 5 Minlaton

Home to the Harry Butler Memorial and the *Red Devil* Bristol Monoplane, believed to be the only genuine one left in the world. The region's first brewery has opened in Minlaton allowing you to see why the town promotes itself as the '*Barley Capital of the World*'.

## 6 Moonta & Moonta Bay

Visit the National Heritage-listed Moonta Mines, grab a Cornish pasty from the local bakery and immerse yourself in the mining and Cornish culture. Moonta offers some great retail therapy and there is no shortage of dining options. Take the kids to Splash Town water park in Moonta Bay for an afternoon of fun!

## 7 Port Broughton

Located at the top of Yorke Peninsula and with an enviable reputation for truly big snapper, this seaside town is a perfect getaway. Port Broughton offers some magnificent sunsets which can be enjoyed over fine food at the local pub or restaurant or whilst throwing a line off the jetty.

## 4 Orrie Cowie Merino Stud, Warooka

The flock was established in 1935 and is still owned and run by the founding family. Learn about the stud, see the sheepdogs in action or become a farmer for a day. Tours available Monday to Saturday by appointment, groups preferred, phone Heather on 0417 898 474.

## 5 Alpacas Chaparral, Minlaton

This is Yorke Peninsula's most awarded alpaca stud. Authentic alpaca produce is available from both the farm and Harvest Corner. Tours are available by appointment. Phone Dee or Shorty on (08) 8853 2354.

## 6 Barley Stacks Wines, Maitland

Specialising in premium wines, enjoy a tasting of Barley Stacks Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Viognier and Rosé at the region's first cellar door. Open daily from 10am, phone (08) 8834 1258.

## 7 Ducatoon Park Horse Stud, Kadina

Ducatoon Park is one of South Australia's leading horse studs. See the new foals, preparation of yearlings for sale and the education of young horses. Tours available daily by appointment, phone Peter or Valmai on (08) 8821 3360 or 0408 859 812.

## 4 Maitland

Surrounded by some of the best barley country in Australia, Maitland's town layout was designed to be like Adelaide, with plenty of parklands and straight streets, making it a very pretty town. It's also a great place to stop for a bite to eat with a number of dining options.

## 5 Minlaton

Explore Minlaton's town walking trail, beginning at the main street and meandering through the outskirts of the town, past the bird hide, and an area of red gums that grow naturally.

## 6 Yorketown

Surrounded by around 200 salt lakes, Yorketown has a rich history in salt harvesting. Today, the crystal formations are a boon for photographers and the red pink to white of some of the lakes catches the eye. Families will love the Weaners Flat playground, walking trail and garden.

## 7 Warooka

As the gateway to the 'bottom end' and Innes National Park, Warooka is a small town with attractions including Ballara Retreat, museum and gallery and a seafood restaurant just outside town.

## 4 Port Victoria

Known as the last of the windjammer ports, Port Victoria exported grain on masted ships to Europe via Cape Horn until 1949; a mural by the foreshore celebrates this history. Divers can explore the eight shipwrecks which form the Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail; or those on land can find out more at the Port Victoria Museum by the jetty.

## 5 Minlaton

Long wide streets make Minlaton a great spot to stop and relax. There's a playground and skate park on the northern side of town, near the Harry Butler Memorial, and a chocolaterie in the main street. Harvest Corner has fantastic local artworks, handmade craft and foods, and the passionate creators can be found there most days.

## 6 Edithburgh

Explore Edithburgh's Mosaic Trail with 94 mosaics along the 2.9km trail. Visit the museum to find out about the *Clan Ranald* shipwreck. Why not book a stay on Troubridge Island in the lighthouse keeper's cottage where you can enjoy the secluded island all to yourself?

## 7 Innes National Park

Innes is a photographer's delight with a must-stop location heading towards Chinaman's Hat to capture the iconic shot favoured by many. Worth a visit is the historic township of Inneston – you can even spend the night in a renovated cottage. Also take in the sight of the 100-year-old *Ethel* shipwreck.







# Coastal adventures

**YORKE PENINSULA IS A HAVEN FOR A VARIETY OF WATER ADVENTURES INCLUDING SURFING, FISHING, BOATING, DIVING, SNORKELLING AND MUCH MORE!**

With a combination of unspoilt ocean waters and marine habitats, including sandy beaches, reefs and islands, there is a huge diversity and an abundance of fish and crustaceans to discover.

Kayaking, paddle boarding and kite surfing are also popular amongst visitors to the region and are available for hire or lessons.

Ask at the nearest Visitor Information Centre or Outlet for more information.

## SURF

Yorke Peninsula is the backdrop for some great major surfing and body boarding competitions and is home to the first dedicated national surfing reserve on Australia's southern coast, Daly Head.

The best surf spots are on Yorke Peninsula's foot between Corny Point to the north and Marion Bay on the southern coastline. Please be aware of the potentially dangerous nature of some surf breaks, take care in remote areas and seek advice from the locals.

**Chinamans, Innes National Park**

A hollow, very powerful left-hand reef break of excellent quality, complete with a hair-raising take-off and a sharp, shallow ledge – definitely for experienced riders only.

**Pondalowie Bay, Innes National Park**

A very good quality, combination beach and reef break.

**Richards, Innes National Park**

About 250 metres north of the main break at Pondalowie, this is a good quality right-hand beach and reef combination that breaks up to 1.5 metres.

**West Cape, Innes National Park**

A left (occasionally right-handed) beach break of up to two metres. Best on north or north-west winds and low to medium tide.

**Baby Lizards**

North of Point Margaret in Formby Bay, Baby Lizards can be good but is generally only an average quality, short, right-hand reef break up to two metres. It's best on easterly winds with a medium to high tide.

**Daly Head**

An average to good quality left and occasional right-hand reef break of up to four metres. Best on south-east to easterly winds and low to medium tide.

**Rock Pool**

Just south of Daly Head, this is a powerful right-hand reef break up to three metres and bigger; best on north-west winds on any tide.

**Salmon Hole**

A good quality, right-hand, semi-point break, up to two metres, Salmon Hole is long, hollow and fast. It's best on north-westerly winds and low to medium tide. Located just south of Daly Head.

**Trespassers**

Near Point Margaret, Trespassers can be reached by Corny Point Road. It's a good quality, right-hand, reef break, up to three metres; definitely for experienced riders only.

## FISHING & BOATING

Wherever you go on Yorke Peninsula's coastlines – Gulf St Vincent, Spencer Gulf or the Bottom End – you'll find some of the best table fish and shellfish in the world; all of it can be caught from a boat, offshore or from a jetty.

There are plenty of good boat ramps and beach launching facilities around Yorke Peninsula for recreational anglers – many with all-tide ramps. These piers are the lifeblood of many coastal towns and offer good fishing for anglers of all ages. Some run into quite deep water, while a couple are close to dry around low tide.

Some have fish cleaning and wash down facilities, and most have dual lanes.

Plump tommy ruffs, garfish (gar), squid and Blue Swimmer crabs (blueys) make up the bulk of the jetty catch, while boaties can expect anything from jumbo snapper to King George whiting. If you're fishing at the bottom end, you might even catch Australian salmon, tuna or the occasional mullet.

### Australian salmon

Found anywhere there is a headland, bluff or surf area, Australian salmon can be caught all year round using pilchards or lures for bait. The best seasons are autumn and winter.

### Blue Swimmer crab

Crabs can be caught all year round but you'll have the best luck in the warmer months. The best baits to use are fish heads and squid, or grab a rake, plastic tub and old sneakers and head off the beach.

### King George whiting

Succulent King George whiting can be caught from both sides of the peninsula and is undoubtedly one of the tastiest meals you will catch from the sea. Between 1 and 31 May, catching and possession of King George whiting is prohibited in the area covering southern Spencer Gulf, southern Gulf St Vincent and Investigator Strait.

### Southern Rock lobster

Rugged coastline areas on the southern shores of Yorke Peninsula are home to Southern Rock lobster. These tasty little morsels are allowed to be caught in the open season (from noon on 1 November to 6pm on 31 May).

### Windara Reef

The first of its kind in South Australia and the largest in Australia, Windara Reef is a shellfish restoration reef located in Gulf St Vincent.

It offers great fishing for recreational fishers with fish species including King George whiting and snapper.

The four-hectare reef site located off Rogues Point, south of Ardrossan, focuses on habitat restoration, specifically the restoration of native shellfish reefs which have been lost from the Yorke Peninsula region.

The reef will be expanded to 20 hectares by the end of 2018 offering recreational fishers and marine lovers another opportunity to explore and experience Yorke Peninsula's waters.

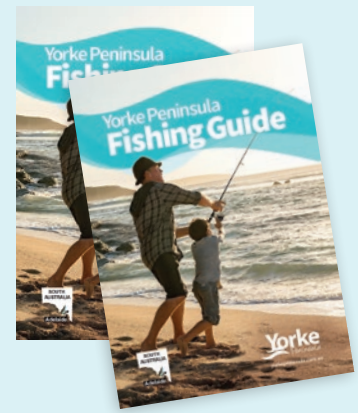
## Useful information

By obeying the rules you'll help protect South Australia's valuable fish stocks. ## DIVE & SNORKEL

Yorke Peninsula offers a range of great dive spots, from jetties to shipwrecks, for both snorkelling and scuba diving.

### The *Zanoni* shipwreck

Lying 10 nautical miles south-east of Ardrossan, the *Zanoni* is the most intact 19th century merchant sailing vessel in South Australian waters. People interested in diving on the wreck must obtain a permit from [environment.sa.gov.au](http://environment.sa.gov.au)

### Edithburgh jetty

This great diving jetty is home to a variety of marine life, including Big-belly seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, Leafy Sea dragons and cuttlefish, plus a variety of fish species and colourful corals.

### Investigator Strait

The Investigator Strait Shipwreck Trail lies between Yorke Peninsula and Kangaroo Island and highlights 10 of the 26 shipwrecks dating from 1849 to 1982 including the famous *Clan Ranald* – a huge 3596 tonne steel steamer which sank west of Troubridge Hill in 1909. Please note that the waters of Investigator Strait can be treacherous, so please take all safety precautions and advise someone of your plans.

### Stenhouse Bay jetty

Difficult access makes this site available to experienced divers only. The dive has clear water with an abundance of marine life.

### Point Gilbert at Port Moorowie

Fantastic shallow snorkelling with great visibility. Opportunity to see a Port Jackson shark nursery and some huge Eagle rays.

### Parsons Beach Reef

On a calm day this is the perfect spot for beginners to snorkel. The reef runs the length of Parsons Beach, with a variety of marine life to observe in the shallows. It can be reached by 4WD vehicle or you can park your car and walk 100 metres to the beach.

### Wardang Island

The Wardang Island Maritime Heritage Trail has eight shipwrecks within 10 nautical miles of one another. Clear shallow waters make it ideal for novice shipwreck divers. Mooring buoys are located at five of the wrecks.

## NATIONAL PARKS & MARINE PARKS

Innes National Park is the perfect place to let your mind drift away as you gaze over the ocean, where on a clear day you can see Kangaroo Island shimmering in the distance. Reconnect with nature in the largest area of pristine native vegetation on Yorke Peninsula.

Its stunning coastal environment is protected by the Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park, which spans Investigator Strait to join with the northcoast of Kangaroo Island.

### Stay

Innes National Park is home to seven renovated heritage lodges within the Inneston historic township, which is the perfect base from which to explore the park. Providing facilities and housing for the 200 gypsum miners and families, Inneston was also home to a bakery, and factories producing plaster of paris and Bellco chalk. A stroll along the Inneston Historic Walk is a great way to explore the village and learn about this special part of the state's mining history.

### Shipwrecks, lighthouses & walking trails

If you enjoy history and nature walks you'll love the Investigator Strait Shipwreck Trail, which tells the story of the many shipwrecks that lie off the coast of Innes National Park. Or you could follow the West Cape Headland walk past the steel West Cape Lighthouse to the lookout, with its breathtaking 360 degree views of Pandalowie Bay, Wedge Island and the Althorpe Islands Conservation Park.

### Wildlife spotting & birdwatching

Innes offers great opportunities to snap photos of iconic Australian animals. Spot Western Grey kangaroos and emus, and you might even see the small Tammar wallaby, which was reintroduced to Innes after becoming extinct on the South Australian mainland in the 1920s.

Southern Spencer Gulf Marine Park is home to pods of dolphins all year round, while schools of Southern Right whales cruise past from May to September. Honeyeaters, Malleefowl and White-bellied Sea eagles are among the park's 140 species of birdlife. Please remember that the park's reptiles are protected and love to lie on the park's roads, so drive carefully.

If you love birdwatching, the Adelaide International Bird Sanctuary National Park – Winaitynaity Pangkara presents an exciting opportunity to explore and appreciate birds in their natural habitat. The bird sanctuary helps to protect resident and migratory shorebirds that gather along the coast of Gulf St Vincent in the north-west of Adelaide. It covers a 60 kilometre stretch of coast from the Barker Inlet to Port Parham, including sections of the Adelaide Dolphin Sanctuary. Each summer, at the peak of the migration season, the mudflats, mangroves and saltmarshes support an estimated 27,000 shorebirds, with 12 species occurring in internationally significant numbers. Many of these birds are listed as threatened species.

### Camping & fishing in Innes National Park

Innes has seven designated campgrounds, with most located just a short sprint from your

next surf or beach adventure. Pandalowie Bay Campground or Pondie – has public toilets, gas barbecues and up to 50 campsites, including areas for caravans, motor homes and trailers (no campfire facilities). To really get away from it all, try Shell Beach, Casuarina or Cable Bay campgrounds. Campfires are not permitted in Innes National Park during fire danger season.

One of the most popular fishing spots in Innes National Park is Browns Beach where you can catch salmon from the beach. Fishing is allowed within marine parks, but not in the sanctuary zones. To find out where you can fish, visit [marineparks.sa.gov.au](http://marineparks.sa.gov.au)

## Visiting the Park

Entry passes to Innes National Park must be booked online at [parks.sa.gov.au](http://parks.sa.gov.au) before arriving or at the Natural Resource Centre at the entrance to the park if arriving between 10am and 3pm.

On Yorke Peninsula you're never far from the water and your next beach adventure. It takes just 30 minutes to drive from coast to coast. Fish, swim, surf, dive, snorkel, kayak, sail, build sandcastles or go beachcombing – the choices are endless.

Enjoy a picnic or barbecue at one of the parks or picnic areas around the region. Visit

great playgrounds and nature play spaces. Minlaton's Gum Flat reserve is a great space for a walk or bike ride. You can also get creative with nature play and keep an eye out for birdlife.

Nearly every town on Yorke Peninsula offers a playground. Kids enjoy the flying fox at Wallaroo's Adventure Park; Kadina's Victoria

Square offers a large playground and with the historic APEX Express train to explore. You can walk around the lake and swing and climb at Yorketown's Weaners Flat reserve and take in the sea views at Stansbury and Port Vincent's foreshore playgrounds.

Check out the region's wildlife and fauna parks. See native animals in their natural habitat at Innes National Park or drop into a working farm for a hands-on experience.

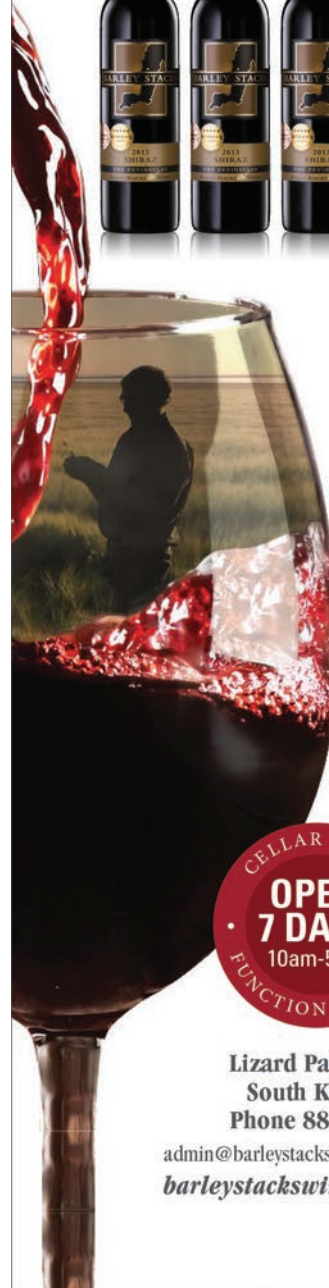

Enjoy the serenity on the Walk the Yorke trail; a 500-kilometre shared walking, cycling and leisure trail which follows the coastline of Yorke Peninsula. The trail links the existing coastal trails and showcases the spectacular coastline, diverse coastal communities and environments unique to Yorke Peninsula.

Walk the Yorke offers everything from a casual stroll to half-day, full-day and multi-day walks.

## Highlights include:

- ▶ Meander through sapphire flats and mangroves, from Port Clinton to Price
- ▶ Explore the famous red cliffs between Tiddy Widdy Beach and Ardrossan
- ▶ Discover the sea-themed mosaic walk in Edithburgh and Sultana Point
- ▶ Visit the bush garden at Port Moorowie and watch the fantastic birdlife and other wildlife in Innes National Park

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## MORE TRAILS

### Barkers Rocks Walking Trail

This five kilometre trail between Barkers Rocks and Port Rickaby features a pristine coastal reserve with great coastal views.

### Edithburgh to Coobowie Mosaic Trail

Winding its way for four kilometres from Edithburgh to Sultana Point, its an easy walk with a beach or cliff top option and wheelchair access. There's also a five kilometre trail to Coobowie.

### Innes National Park walking trails

The park has excellent walking trails ranging from short loops to half-day hikes, and plenty of opportunities to see birds and wildlife.

### Minlaton Walking Trail

Starting at the main street, this six kilometre walk heads to the fauna reserve before meandering through the outskirts of town. The trail includes interpretive signs about the river red gums –the only area on southern Yorke Peninsula where these trees grow naturally.

### Moonta Mines walking trails

Discover the history of this copper mining region via three marked trails: Ryans Walk, Hancocks Walk and Hughes Walk.

### Port Broughton Historic Walking Trail

Follow the booklet and the historic landmarks and learn about Port Broughton's history.

### Port Hughes Coastal Trail

Follow the foreshore from Simms Cove to South Beach – a distance of 2.5 kilometres. Along the trail, 10 signs tell the history of Port Hughes.

### Port Victoria Geology Trail

This trail highlights volcanic action from nearly 2000 million years ago and takes about two hours for this easy three kilometre walk.

### Port Vincent Walking Trail

This trail runs through native scrub on the northern boundary of Port Vincent. Entry is north of the marina.

### Stansbury Coastal Trail

This six kilometre, three-stage walk follows the foreshore around to the back beach where you can see various birdlife. Then choose a cliff top or beach walk to Pitts Cutting.

### Wallaroo, Kadina and Moonta town walking trails

Taking about one hour, these trails give visitors an insight into the town history and their old buildings.

# Our heritage

YORKE PENINSULA HAS A RICH CULTURAL HERITAGE, WEAVING TOGETHER THE DREAMTIME STORIES OF ITS ABORIGINAL PEOPLE AND LATER EUROPEAN SETTLERS.

The Aboriginal people of Yorke Peninsula are the Narungga people, also known as Adjahdura. They have a strong spiritual and physical connection to the land and sea. Dreaming stories tell how their country was shaped and how the land, sea, rivers, sky and stars were created. Point Pearce is the Aboriginal community on Yorke Peninsula. Cultural protocols exist to access Aboriginal land.

For an amazing insight into the Aboriginal people of this country, and of their rich cultural heritage, dreaming stories and traditions, walk in their footsteps with Aboriginal Cultural Tours South Australia.

In 1859, copper was discovered near Kadina which created a mining boom that attracted skilled workers from many parts of Britain, including Cornwall. So many skilled Cornish miners worked the Moonta and Wallaroo mines that the area became known as 'Australia's Little Cornwall'. The mines closed in 1923. The Moonta Mines Museum provides a fascinating overview of the region's mining heritage.

In 1860, a successful wheat crop at Green Plains, near Kadina, saw the explosion of agriculture. Kadina's Farm Shed Museum & Tourism Centre, as well as the Maitland Museum, provide an insight into the lives of the region's pioneering families and the impact their farming practices had on modern Australian agriculture.

The ingenuity of early settlers is on display at the Ardrossan Museum, cataloguing the history of the Stump Jump Plough. In 1876, this remarkable invention ended the laborious, back-breaking work of clearing mallee stumps.

The rich limestone soils soon produced bumper crops and Yorke Peninsula became known as the 'Barley Capital of the World'.

It's still one of the richest wheat and barley regions in the world and many of the biggest breweries in Australia, Europe and Asia use malted barley from this region.

Until the early 20th century, the only way to transport this cereal to Britain was by ship, and windjammers were a common sight along the coastline. The Wallaroo Heritage & Nautical Museum, Port Victoria's Maritime Museum and the Edithburgh Museum all provide visitors with a vivid insight into the fascinating history of these amazing times.

Enjoy the stories of pioneer aviator, Captain Harry Butler by visiting the National Trust Museum in Minlaton, home to his infamous monoplane - *Red Devil* - believed to be the only genuine one of its kind left in the world.

Located in the south-eastern corner overlooking Troubridge Island, Edithburgh has always been one of Yorke Peninsula's landmarks.

The town has hotels, motels, a caravan park, coastal golf course and parklands laid out to the same design as those in Adelaide by Colonel William Light.

There isn't much need for swimming pools near the beach but Edithburgh has one and the tidal saltwater pool is a hit in summer. Edithburgh is an excellent spot for anglers with mullet, yellowfin, whiting and larger fish all popular catches. Fish from the jetty, boat or beach, and boat launching is made easy with twin boat ramps and floating pontoons.

Known for its spectacular diving and snorkelling, the jetty has a variety of marine

life, from Leafy Sea dragons to Big-belly seahorses, Port Jackson sharks, cuttlefish and a range of fish and corals.

At the museum, learn about the large salt industry that once dominated the town and discover the historic *Clan Ranald* and *Marion* shipwrecks that lie just off the coast.

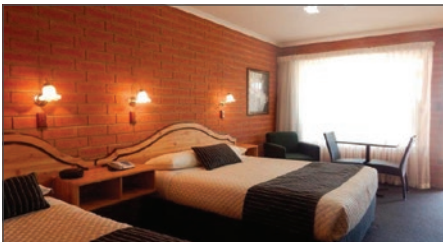

In its heyday in the late 19th century, Kadina had a population of 20,000. In 1859, copper was discovered near Kadina. This brought many skilled Cornish miners and their families to the region, who left a mark that can still be seen today.

Kadina's Royal Exchange Hotel was simply the Exchange Hotel until the Duke of Clarence stayed here in 1880. The Duke is considered a suspect in perhaps the most infamous murder case of all times, Jack the Ripper.

Families will enjoy the large playground in Victoria Square Park which includes plenty of shade and barbecue facilities.

The indoor play centre at the tourism centre is great for families. You can hire a bike to explore Kadina's historic township or walking trails. There is an 18-hole golf course with clubhouse and a range of cafés, restaurants and hotels.

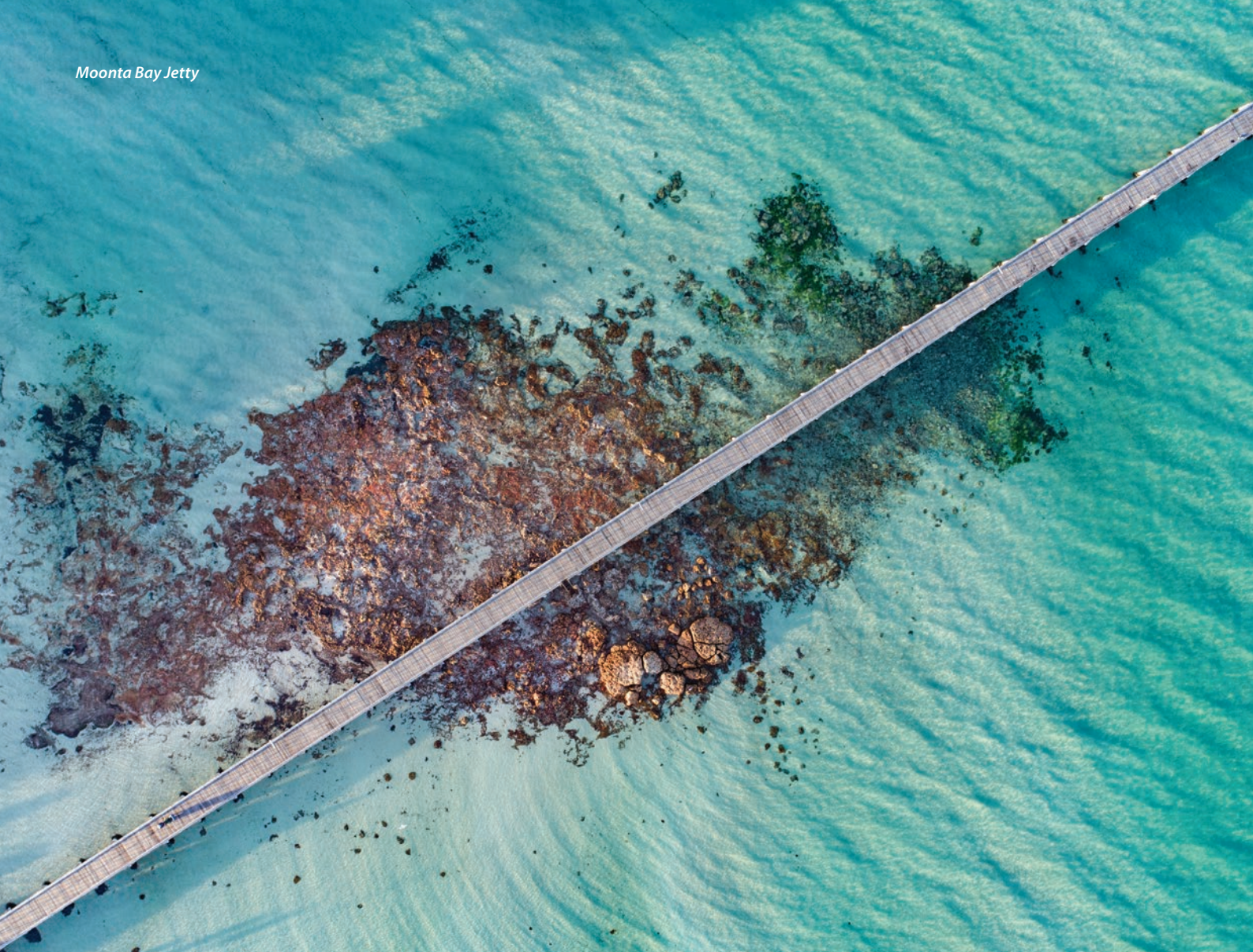

Believed to be the only genuine Bristol left in the world, it has been restored to its original condition.

Moonta's origins in 1860 were very fortunate – a shepherd noticed traces of copper on a wombat burrow, which led to the establishment of the Moonta Mining Company that soon became one of the richest copper mines in Australia. The ensuing flood of skilled miners from Cornwall changed the state's cultural mix. Today, the Kernewek Lowender Copper Coast Cornish Festival is the world's largest Cornish festival held every two years in

Moonta, Wallaroo and Kadina; with the next festival 13-19 May 2019.

There are many beautiful old buildings in town, including the Moonta Mines Museum in the Moonta Mines Model School. Built around 1878, the museum is worth a visit and a tourist train can take you around the heritage areas. You can also enjoy a stroll along the main street where you'll find a variety of shops from antiques to giftware, bakeries, hotels, cafés, cinema and an art gallery.

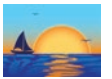

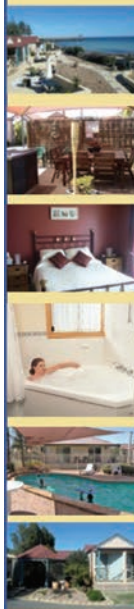

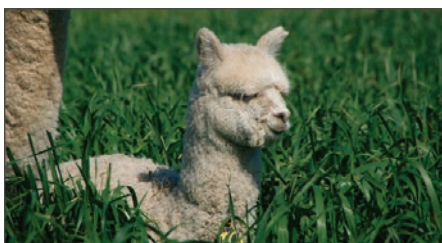

## Drive on left in Australia

Take care when driving on Australian roads. Be sure to drive on the left-hand side of two-way roads. Obey the road signs and remember that speed limits are strictly enforced. You must not drive if your blood alcohol level is 0.05% or higher, nor are you permitted to use a handheld mobile phone when driving.
